



The counselling service also offers phone counselling to ensure that you can access this resource off campus.

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Notre Dame is committed to ensuring you can continue your studies and remain connected while you are off campus through streamed lectures, virtual interactive tutorials, sharing and collaboration, and more.

Academic support

Throughout your degree, you will have access to a range of programs and opportunities to help you succeed at university. Most support is provided free of charge and is delivered via demand-driven workshops and individual appointments with a Learning Advisor. You can join workshops on topics designed to address the challenges common to university life, such as referencing and academic integrity, time management, academic essay writing, critical reading, note-taking, understanding feedback from assessments, and exam anxiety.

English as an additional language support

If English is not your first language and you need additional assistance to manage your studies in English, you can make an appointment to see a Learning Advisor with specialised skills in English for Academic Purposes. You can make one-on-one appointments and/or join small study groups to build your skills.

Support for Indigenous students

Notre Dame is committed to providing an educational environment that acknowledges, respects and embraces Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples' cultures. The University is also committed to providing culturally appropriate support for all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students. 
Access and inclusion

Investing in your future

Notre Dame is committed to making all its programs as affordable and accessible as possible, with its fee structure reflecting this goal.

How fees are calculated

Fees are calculated based on the discipline and study load of each course undertaken by students. For the majority of programs, courses studied do not all fall within the same discipline. For example, a student enrolled in a Bachelor of Education undertakes courses of study that are classified as 'education' and some that are classified as 'humanities'. In this example, the fee for the humanities courses is calculated against the Humanities discipline, while the fee for the education courses is calculated against the Education discipline. To access individual course costs please visit the University's website.

Pre-University Program

Eligible students undertaking the Tertiary Pathway Program who are allocated a Commonwealth Supported Place and have lodged a HECS-HELP form will pay no tuition fees.

Commonwealth Supported Places and HECS-HELP

Notre Dame offers Commonwealth Supported Places (CSP) in selected undergraduate programs.

Australian citizens, holders of permanent humanitarian visas and eligible New Zealand citizens who are allocated a CSP are able to access HECS-HELP and defer all or part of their tuition fees through a Federal Government loan.

Permanent residents of Australia and New Zealand citizens must pay their fees in full by the course Census Date.

All Indigenous students of Notre Dame are able to access Commonwealth Supported Places and HECS-HELP for undergraduate and some postgraduate programs.

Fee paying places and FEE-HELP

Notre Dame offers full-fee paying places for undergraduate domestic students in a number of programs. Australian citizens, permanent humanitarian visa holders and eligible New Zealand citizens are able to access the FEE-HELP loan scheme. This program allows eligible students to borrow all or part of their tuition fees from the Federal Government.

How will I pay?

The HECS-HELP loan scheme assists eligible students who have been allocated a Commonwealth Supported Place in paying their tuition fees. The FEE-HELP loan scheme assists eligible students who have been allocated a fee paying place in paying their tuition fees. Repayments in both schemes can be deferred until students are in the workforce. Students should consult studyassist.gov.au for further information and up-to-date eligibility requirements.

Additional study costs

The additional costs of study will vary from student to student. Additional costs include textbooks, uniforms, accommodation, public transport, photocopying, stationery and food.

Financial assistance

How do I apply to Notre Dame?

Notre Dame is a direct application university. You can apply online at notredame.edu.au/forms/apply

Notre Dame is a private university. Does that make it more expensive than other universities?

Notre Dame's tuition fees are similar to those charged by public universities for Australian citizens. There are no up-front tuition fees for eligible students accessing the Government's Higher Education Loan Program (HELP). Students with Commonwealth Supported Places who are Australian citizens, holders of permanent humanitarian visas and eligible New Zealand citizens have access to the HECS-HELP loan scheme. Commonwealth Supported Places are available in undergraduate Nursing, undergraduate Education and graduate-entry Medicine programs. Eligible students in other programs have access to FEE-HELP. Can I change my program preferences?

Changing between programs is possible if you meet the program entry requirements. Please email the Admissions Office at **sydney.admissions@nd.edu.au** to submit your request to change programs.

Are there any alternative entry pathways?

The Notre Dame Study Centre offers an alternative entry pathway program, the Tertiary Pathway Program (TPP). Upon successful completion of this program, students can apply for an undergraduate program in the Schools of Arts & Sciences, Business, Education, Nursing, and Philosophy & Theology. The TPP assists students to develop confidence, readiness and skills to prepare them for Bachelorlevel study.

Can I do part of my degree overseas?

Yes, you can. In our Study Abroad program, most degrees include the option for students to travel to partner universities in North America, Asia and Europe and have their studies overseas count towards their degree.

Ineligible New Zealand citizens and permanent visa holders are not able to use the HECS-HELP loan scheme and therefore must pay their student contribution by the first Census Date on their invoice.

FULL-FEE PAYING PLACES AVAILABLE AND INDICATIVE ANNUAL FEE FOR 2021

All Australian citizens, eligible New Zealand citizens and permanent humanitarian visa holders can use the Commonwealth Government's FEE-HELP loan scheme to pay for the cost of their tuition. Ineligible New Zealand citizens and permanent visa holders are not able to use the FEE-HELP loan scheme and therefore must pay their tuition fees by the due date on their invoice.


